




BITE ME



NORTH LAKE TAHOE IS A FOUR-SEASON DESTINATION THAT SPANS TWO STATES, CALIFORNIA AND NEVADA. THERE ARE 12 UNIQUE TOWNS THAT MAKE UP NORTH LAKE TAHOE, WITH EACH TOWN OFFERING ENDLESS FUN AND OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES FOR ANY TYPE OF ADVENTURE YOU'RE LOOKING FOR. WHETHER IT'S EXPERIENCING THE BREATHTAKING PANORAMIC VIEWS VIA A SCENIC HIKE, BIKING SOME OF THE BEST TRAILS IN THE AREA, OR SPENDING A DAY ON THE WATER, NORTH LAKE TAHOE IS THE PLACE TO BE THIS SUMMER.

With Lake Tahoe at its center, it's no surprise that there is an abundance of water activities to keep you cool this summer. There is endless fun on the North Shore with kayaking, canoeing, and even parasailing. In Kings Beach, Tahoe Paddle & Oar is a full-service paddle sports shop with kayak and paddleboard rentals, along with guided tours to help you navigate around the lake. A popular paddle route is the Lake Tahoe Water Trail, which offers 72 miles of shoreline. It's an eco-friendly option for the eco-conscious traveler, as paddlers can use the Water Trail website (gotahoenorth.com) and Lake Tahoe Water Trail Map & Access Guide.

A unique way to connect with Lake Tahoe is through a glass bottom boat tour. In Kings Beach and Incline Village, you can experience the alpine blue waters with Wild Society, a clear kayak rental company. Wild Society allows you to see Lake Tahoe like no other, and they will help you create one-of-a-kind memories surrounded by good friends and clear water. If you want to experience an even more breathtaking view, North Shore Parasail and Tahoe Aquatic Center in Kings Beach offers a parasailing adventure with a panoramic view of Lake Tahoe. In the summer, visitors can get aboard the Tahoe Gal, a Mississippi paddle wheeler docked in Tahoe City that cruises all the way to Emerald Bay.

North Lake Tahoe is not just water sports, it is also home to some of the best hiking trails in California that range from easy to difficult, with a trail for every skill level. Whether it's hiking through the forest around Tahoe City or exploring a trail with waterfalls, North Lake Tahoe allows for an unforgettable experience. Shirley Canyon Trail is a 5.8-mile outand-back trail near Olympic Valley that lasts an average of three hours and 44 minutes to complete. The route takes hikers up into the mountains and along the route; a beautiful waterfall serves as a perfect photo stopping point.





North Lake Tahoe is also home to one of the only via ferratas in North America – the Tahoe Via Ferrata. This activity invites visitors to ascend an 800-foot vertical cliff and combines hiking, climbing, and scrambling. The best part? No experience is required, making it accessible to those of all ages looking to partake in the fun. Be sure to also consider the Tahoe Treetop Adventure Park, which is a ropes and zipline course, with a variety of different courses for those of all fitness levels.

North Lake Tahoe offers a plethora of biking resources, bike shops, and bike tours. Whether you are looking to grab some gear for your first time riding up a mountain or looking for a guided tour, North Lake Tahoe is the place to be. Tahoe Adventure Company has high-quality biking trips and tours that follow the trails and waters of Lake Tahoe. On the west shore of Lake Tahoe at Homewood Mountain Resort's North Lodge, visitors can explore a paved bicycle path on an easy-to-pedal cruiser bike from a fleet of Marin bicycles. It's important to follow the safety tips of the region, which include following a bike path whenever available, knowing where the nearest repair shops are, always having a phone on hand, using proper hand signals, following road traffic rules, respecting the wildlife, and bringing extra tools in case of an emergency.

During the summer in North Lake Tahoe, visitors can hit the green on six championship golf courses and four executive courses in the North Lake Basin. If that isn't enough, another 14 are located an hour drive from the North Shore. The Tahoe City Golf Course, which was established in 1917 and designed by May "Queenie" Dunn Hupfel, is a favorite in the North Lake Tahoe Region. There are nine holes, par-33 and 2,700 yards of green to play on, along with options for breakfast and lunch.

The Incline Village Championship Golf Course offers two distinct golf courses: a par-72 Championship Course and a par-58 Mountain Course. *Golfweek* magazine rated the Championship Course a "Top 10 Best Golf Course You Can Play in Nevada." Also in Incline Village is the UC Davis Tahoe Environmental Research Center, the only science center in the Lake Tahoe area. After spending a day on the course, stop by and see the hands-on activities that help people learn about the lake's ecosystem, how it's changing, and what you can do to help protect it.

Overall, North Lake Tahoe is a destination with so much to do year-round. No matter when you visit or what activity you choose for your North Lake Tahoe experience, you're encouraged to take the Traveler Responsibility Pledge, which commits travelers to six travel pledges that amplify environmental stewardship efforts in the region. Together, we can enjoy the natural beauty of North Lake Tahoe yearround while working to preserve it for generations to come.





THEY TOOK ART TO WAR ... AND WON!

In 1944, a top secret unit of combat artists hoodwinked the Nazi forces and helped to liberate Europe using inflatable combat decoys and their own ingenuity. Called "Ghost Army," experience the little-known history of the U.S. Army's 23rd Headquarters Special Troops in *Ghost Army: The Combat Con Artists of World War.*

After all, when deception is the name of the game, who else are you going to call but a highly talented group of artists and engineers to execute elaborate deceptions with inflatable tanks, planes and artillery units, false radio transmissions, layered sound effects, and even phony generals? These creatives – 1,100 strong – carried out 22 large-scale deceptions that would ultimately sway World War II in the Allies' favor.

Little wonder that the Ghost Army also produced iconic names in the art, film, and fashion industries: Veterans of this top secret unit included fashion designer Bill Blass, American modern artist Ellsworth Kelly, and the iconic photographer Art Kane.

DISCOVER THE ART OF A BAY AREA ORIGINAL

If exploring mountain trails is your vibe, step into the world of a true local legend, artist Adaline Kent. She grew up in the shadow of Northern California's Mount Tamalpais where her family donated the land that later became Muir Woods National Monument. The artist herself would later self-identify as an "addict of the High Sierra," spending her summers and winters exploring that mountainous landscape. Her adventures are reflected in the rugged, angular aesthetic you can see and feel in *Adaline Kent: The Click of Authenticity*.

The exhibition's title originates from Kent herself. Known to fill notebooks, Kent proclaimed in one poetic passage written in 1956 entitled *Classic Romantic Mystic*, "I want to hear the click of authenticity." It was a yearning that propelled her work to original and astounding heights.



Her drawings and sculptures channel the smell of pine, the high granite peaks, and the wide blue sky. Experience all the natural, the real, and the feel of the Sierra Nevada in a way that makes it hard to believe her entire body of work was nearly lost to history.

Luckily, the Museum is bringing her back in this retrospective exhibition that features 120 works on view for the first time in more than 60 years. Trace the artist's journey as her work transformed the natural world into figurative sculptures and then to abstract and sometimes mystical expressions. The exhibition will make you feel like you're encountering something monolithic and ancient, but also strikingly original and modern.

One thing's for sure: It's an escape from the ordinary world into art.





WHAT ARE YOU WAITING FOR?

If you're ready to perfect the art of the getaway, there's no better place to do it than the Nevada Museum of Art. Open 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Tuesday through Sunday. 

A R T O W N brings the world's finest performing artists to the Biggest Little City each year. Celebrating its 28th festival season, Artown now presents events and performances year-round, with its flagship footprint planted every summer in Reno during the 31 days of July. The public can enjoy a dizzying array of more than 500 headliner, multicultural, and children's events during the festival, 90% of which are wholly produced by local presenting artists and organizations who are tasked to pick a date, find a venue, and do a show. With in-person multidisciplinary events, exhibits, programs, performances, shows, concerts, historical tours, readings, recitals, classes, lectures, and workshops held at more than 100 venues and pop-ups city and Washoe Countywide, Artown's financial impact on the local economy was estimated at \$36 million in 2022.

Discover Opening Night and Parade from McKinley Arts to Wingfield Park Amphitheater, 4:30 p.m. to 6:15 p.m. Artown kicks things off with its annual **Discover the Arts** interactive children's programs and arts activities at McKinley Arts & Culture Center, where kids create art, crafts, musical instruments, and noisemakers for the parade. Next, band camp meets circus, as the popular parade is led by the super funky makers of mischief **MarchFourth Marching Band**, with electric bass, guitar, a four-piece percussion corps, a seven-part brass section, dancers, acrobats, stilt walkers who'll strut and groove down Riverside Drive. At 8 p.m., the party continues as two-time Grammy-winners **Ranky Tanky** take the Wingfield Amphitheater stage playing their unique blend of jazz-inflected Gullah music, the traditional roots music from the low country of their native Charleston, South Carolina.

Robert Z. Hawkins Amphitheater, 8 p.m. **Jesse & Joy** is a mega-selling, award-winning sibling pop duo from Mexico City. Widely acclaimed and accorded by their legions of fans, the talented Jesse Huerta plays piano, lead guitar, and sings harmony, while Joy Huerta is lead vocalist and plays rhythm guitar.
